# TAIRUA community guide to emergen<u>cies</u>

### 🗩 会 STORMS AND FLOODS/SLIPS

Storms and severe weather can happen at any time of the year, even in the middle of summer. This includes strong winds, heavy rain, and thunderstorms.

Storms often bring localised flooding and they can block access to or from your home or bach.

#### WHAT TO DO

- Charge all devices while you still have power.
- Secure anything that could cause damage in strong winds (such as outoor furniture).
- Stay inside and bring your pets inside. If you have to leave, take them with you.
- Take measures to reduce potential flood damage and make sure your insurance policy covers you for flood damage.
- Don't drive through flood waters your car is not a submarine.
- Don't walk through floodwaters they could be contaminated with raw sewerage or contain dangerous debris.
- Check the tide times. Flooding often happens at high tide and recedes at low tide.
- Listen to the radio and follow the instructions of emergency services.
- Check metservice.com for real-time updates.
- Check TCDC's Facebook page to see what other people around the Coromandel are reporting.
- Have a household emergency plan.

### 🛞 🝙 EARTHQUAKE AND TSUNAMI

An earthquake could cause a tsunami. Know the natural warning signs:

- » A violent earthquake that makes it hard to stand up.
- » A vibrating earthquake lasting 1-2 minutes.
- » Sudden tidal changes at the beach or harbour.
- » Loud roaring noises from the sea.
- » The map shows the tsunami evacuation zones.

#### WHAT TO DO

- Have an emergency plan for your work or household.
- If you experience the natural warning signs, immediately move uphill or inland.
- Listen to the radio and follow instructions of emergency services.

# Fire

Fire can start from natural causes like floods and earthquakes (causing electical shorts), volcanic activity, lightning strikes and high wind. Low rainfall and drought can also cause an increase in the number of fires started.

#### WHAT TO DO

- Have an escape plan.
- Decide WHEN you need to escape.
- Make sure your home has smoke alarms.
- Apply for a permit if you want to light open fires in a restricted season.
- Minimise wildfire risk by maintaining "3m" of cleared space, no trees, around your home.
- Drop to the floor and get out of the building or away from the fire.
- Call 111.

# Tsunami Evacuation

- walk where possible -

#### WHERE WILL YOU GO?

#### PLAN A

The white shaded areas are 20 or more metres above sea level and are the safe evacuation zones.

#### PLAN B

If you don't think you have time to get to the Safe Evacuation Zone, aim for the areas not shaded blue. These have a lesser risk of inundation than the blue (wet) shaded areas.



#### Natural warnings local source tsunami

WALK immediately to the nearest SAFE ZONE.

If you are on the coast and experience any of the following:

- Feel an earthquake that lasts longer than a minute or is strong enough to knock you off your feet
- See a sudden rise or fall in sea level or hear loud and unusual sounds from the sea.

If you are in a coastal area prepare to evacuate immediately. Check radio updates and your Red Cross Hazard app alerts. If the information confirms an immediate evacuation is advised, go as far up and as far inland as you can and keep listening to your local radio station for updates until you are advised it is safe to return.

#### DO NOT RELY ON THE TSUNAMI WARNING SIREN AS YOUR ONLY FORM OF WARNING.

Evacuate immediately. Waves can arrive in minutes or take over an hour. Take a go bag with enough supplies in case you can't get home for three days.

### Distant source tsunami

These are made by very strong earthquakes on the other side of the ocean. You will know they are coming because Civil Defence will send public messages out telling you what you need to do, so there's no need to panic.
